THAT:

- i. Council develop strategic links with other key players in planning and providing sporting and recreational services for the benefit of the local community.
- ii. Council establish and promote a best practice culture of continuous improvement in the management, provision and usage of sport and recreational facilities, programmes and services at the local level.
- iii. Council work to increase and enhance lifelong participation in sporting activities through its provision of sporting facilities.
- iv. Council recognise and encourage the social, health and economic benefits of participation in sporting and recreational activities.
- v. Council in its provision of sporting facilities, consider the issues of access and equity to ensure that residents are able to participate in sporting and physical activities for enjoyment regardless of the socio economic status, race, age or gender, ability and geographic location.
- vi. Council consider the issues of quality, safety, community benefit, enjoyment potential, health benefits and diversity and choice in its provision of sporting and recreational facilities.
