Sarah is passionate about reading and homelessness, and marrying the two together. In 2007 she gave up her successful 26 year career as a communications and documentary producer to concentrate on the only library for homeless people in Australia. Sarah aims to make books available for homeless people and raise awareness around this marginalised group in our community, as well as encourage literacy. The Footpath Library runs mobile library services in Sydney, Melbourne and Perth, taking food for the mind and soul to the streets.

Community Group of the Year Cargo Village Markets

Over \$9,000 was raised and the Cargo Community decided they should hold more markets. They have held five additional markets and funds have been donated to different charities.

So far they have supported the Leukaemia Foundation, Prostate Cancer, Aussie Helper's Drought Relief, Beyond Blue, Dementia and Children's

Cancer Institute. So far over \$15,000 has been raised and donated. The Cargo and wider communities have been generous with supporting the events.
