**DEPUTY GENERAL MANAGER - CABONNE INFRASTRUCTURE'S
REPORT**

Fixing Local Roads is a \$500 million NSW Government program that supports shovel-ready projects to repair, maintain and seal priority local roads across NSW. Applications for Round 3 of the program closed 16 July 2021. Council submitted three applications as detailed below. Each project is currently listed in council's adopted budget funded by council through the Federal Governments Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.

The projects which have had applications submitted are as follows.

Council's current program of works for these roads seeks to address resealing of the highest priority sections of the roads to prevent accelerated deterioration of road pavement. The increased scope of works will allow for further rehabilitation and select road widening for these roads.

Announcements of successful applications are expected in November 2022.
