Embark on the Pioneer Trail and explore the rich history of the Cabonne Shire. This scenic drive takes you through charming towns and villages, showcasing historic landmarks, museums, and the stories of early settlers. Along the way, enjoy stunning countryside views and discover the enduring legacy of Cabonne's pioneering spirit.

Start in Orange, the birthplace of Banjo Paterson, and journey through Molong's colonial heritage, Cumnock's vibrant public art, and Yeoval's Banjo Paterson Bush Park. Finish at Dubbo's Taronga Western Plains Zoo, home to incredible wildlife and unforgettable experiences.

Explore the Orange Region Wine Trail through Orange, Borenore, and Nashdale. Visit boutique cellar doors, enjoy award-winning wines, and soak up the warm hospitality and stunning rural landscapes set against the backdrop of Gaanha Bula (Mount Canobolas).

ART & HERITAGE Journey the Art & Heritage Trail from Manildra's historic Amusu Theatre through Cudal, Cargo, and Canowindra's galleries and museums, to Eugowra's iconic murals and bushranger tales.

## **NASHDALE**

A charming village nestled in the heart of Cabonne Shire. Known for its award-winning vineyards and orchards. Visitors can enjoy wine tastings, fruit and luxury glamping Outdoor accommodation. lovers can explore nearby Gaanha Bula (Mount Canobolas) for hiking and breathtaking views. With its proximity to Orange, it's the perfect spot for a tranquil escape.







## **YEOVAL**

Once home to legendary poet Banjo Paterson, Yeoval combines literary heritage with true-blue country charm. Centrally located between Dubbo and Orange, it's home to one of Australia's largest public artworks at the Banjo Paterson Bush Park, and the Yeoval Museum preserves the town's heritage in the home of a former saddler and bootmaker with original furnishings and memorabilia displays. Yeoval is an ideal base for regional adventures - visit the classic country pub, stroll along peaceful Buckinbah Creek, or drop into local farms for an authentic country experience.



# CANOWINDRA

Renowned for hot air ballooning, Canowindra offers stunning views of multi-coloured paddocks and vineyards. Wander historic Gaskill Street, where Victorian-era buildings. house boutique shops, cosy cafés and art galleries. Follow the Belubula River to the Swinging Bridge and explore 360-million -year-old fossils at the Age of Fishes Museum. Canowindra is heritage, adventure, and charm in one unforgettable stop.














### CARGO


Tucked in the foothills of Gaanha Bula (Mt Canobolas), Cargo offers a peaceful escape with gold-rush history and scenic charm. Wander into the old general store, transformed into a rustic coffee and gift shop, or visit the historic hotel established in 1868 still retaining its old-world charm. Hike, cycle, or sip nearby wines - this quiet escape is perfect for nature lovers and history buffs, and anyone chasing a slower, richer kind of adventure.


















#### CUDAL

Just 35km west of Orange, Cudal offers a scenic rural escape, with wheat, sheep and canola fields. Visitors can choose from the local cafes and restaurants, shop at the large saddlery and explore the Cabonne Food, Wine and Cultural Centre. Visit the Sir Thomas Mitchell Monument and enjoy outdoor activities like the community pump track and seasonal pool. Keep your eye out for platypus in the local creek!

Don't miss the historical museum, home to an extensive collection of local history and heritage items. Nature lovers can explore the platypus-friendly creek trails and visit the culturally significant gravesite of Wiradjuri man, Yuranigh,
